# VHS Wildlife Animal Fun Facts





### **PEAFOWLS (PEACOCKS)**

Sentosa is believed to have the largest number of peafowls (more popularly known as peacocks) in Singapore. It comprises a mixture of Indian blue peafowls and Javan green peafowls. They are omnivorous and their diet consists of seeds, insects, fruits, small mammals and reptiles.

They have beautiful feathers that can be displayed in a spectacular fan of magnificent colours.

They are most frequently spotted within the Heritage Courtyard area.

Surrounded by the peace and tranquility of lush greenery, it is a common sight to spot different types of animals within Village Hotel Sentosa precinct as 70% of Sentosa Island is covered by secondary rainforest, and is home to many different kinds of animals. Here are some interesting facts of the wildlife that you may have spotted at Village Hotel Sentosa.



#### **ORIENTAL PIED HORNBILLS**

The oriental pied hornbills are the only wild hornbills found in Singapore. Unlike most other hornbills, oriental pied hornbills can be found outside primary rainforests and may visit inhabited areas to feed on fruit.

Oriental pied hornbills eat mainly fruit, but they do eat insects and small animals including reptiles, birds and mammals.

# VHS Wildlife Animal Fun Facts





### RED JUNGLEFOWL (JUNGLE ROOSTER)

The red junglefowl is the wild ancestor of the domestic chicken. They can be found from the Western Himalayas to Southern China and throughout Southeast Asia.

Omnivorous by nature, their diet consists of insects, roots, fruits and seeds and forage in large parties.

The red junglefowl was included in the first Resident of Singapore William Farquhar's collection of natural-history drawings, indicating their presence in the Malay Peninsula in the early 19th century.



### **COMMON PALM CIVET (CIVET CAT)**

Common palm civet is one of the species of civet that can be seen in Singapore. Nocturnal by nature, they can be found living in trees and high places such as forests, parks, mangroves and even roof spaces of buildings in urban areas.

Being omnivorous, their diet includes fruits such as mangoes and bananas, and will eat small snakes, small birds, insects and rats. In Singapore, they frequently eat the fruits of the Fishtail Palm and seed pods of the Rain Tree.

### DO YOU KNOW?

Coffee beans that have been eaten by civets and passed through their digestive system are highly valued in some neighboring countries in Southeast Asia. It is some of the most expensive coffee in the world, but comes at a cost to civets which are often poached from the wild and kept in inhumane conditions to produce the beans.

# Hort Park

For Nature Lovers



Located in south-west of Singapore. Hort Park is the first one-stop gardening lifestyle hub in Asia. Situated in the Southern Ridges, HortPark serves as a park connector that allows visitors to travel around Kent Ridge Park, Telok Blangah Hill Park and Mount Faber Park.

Check out the following places while you are there!



### **MOUNT FABER PEAK**

Located 100metres above sea level, Mount Faber Peak is the only hilltop destination in Singapore with breathtaking scenic views of the harbour, Sentosa, the Singapore skyline and the home of the Cable Car.

#### HENDERSON WAVES


The Henderson Waves bridge is the highest pedestrian bridge in Singapore. The best way to explore the bridge is through the Southern Ridges Walk, a five-kilometre hiking trail that takes you through three major parks: Kent Ridge Park, Telok Blangah Hill Park and Mount Faber Park





## **CANOPY WALK** KENT RIDGE PARK

Located at the eastern end of metre long boardwalk Canopy can trek on to HortPark, Telok Blangah Hill Park and Mount Ridges Walk.

# Labrador Park

For Heritage Explorers



Located in the souther part of mainland Singapore, Labrador Nature Reserve is an oasis of tranquillity and natural wonders. Thriving with wildlife, the park is a favourite haunt of nature lovers. Labrador Nature Reserve is part of the Southern Ridges, which also comprises Mount Faber Park, Telok Blangah Hill Park, and Kent Ridge Park.

Check out the following places while you are there!



### BUKIT CHERMIN BOARDWALK

Take a leisurely stroll along this 330m elevated coastal boardwalk, while enjoying the different views of the expansive waters of Keppel Harbour, the lush greenery of Bukit Chermin Hill, and the distant rocky cliffs of Sentosa island.

### **KEPPEL BAY BRIDGE**

The Keppel Bay Bridge is the longest cable-stayed bridge in Singapore along Keppel Bay Vista, spanning 250 metres across the strait linking the private Keppel Island to mainland





### LABRADOR BATTERY

Come explore and have a glimpse of Singapore history at this mighty fortress that was fitted with artillery guns manned by soldiers to protect the Keppel Harbour in the 1940s.



A craggy granite outcrop which formerly stood at the gateway to Keppel Harbour and also known locally in earlier times as Batu Berlayar which means Sailing Rock. Ships used to sail through the Dragon teeth gate (in between the two stones) in order to reach Keppel Harbour.

# TIONG BAHRU AIR RAID SHELTER






